

You are invited to make a 2025 Giving Commitment at firstpreswheaton.org/Generosity2025.




- Our church tithes 10 percent to mission. For those new to our church, that means that, from our budget each year, a tenth goes to outreach and community causes.
- Our pastors tithe. Our pastoral leaders give ten percent of their personal budgets right back to the church. They understand that we can't be a giving church if our spiritual leaders are not modeling generosity for members and friends of the church to follow.
- If you're not already in the habit, we pray this is the year you begin giving in a significant way, even tithing, to support God's mission through our church.

Our giving church has been growing in generosity and attendance. From 2022 to 2023, total giving increased by 6 percent and from 2023 to 2024, average Sunday attendance increased by 15 percent. We need your help to keep growing in health and vitality!

In October, Pastor Kellen will share a sermon series on The Giving Church, focusing on generosity of time, talents, and resources. In the coming week, you'll receive a letter from him encouraging your response, which will include a commitment card. Commitment Sunday is October 20. You can also make your commitment online. Jesus said, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).

Pray that God would bless us with abundant resources to fulfill our mission as a church, and pray for how the Lord may be leading you to give generously, to even tithe, in support of our vision of inviting all generations into


Beyond Existence: Psalm 116 and Ministry in India Sunday, October 6 at 10:30 a.m. Led by Rev. Rocky Marpna



Now, on to planning for Christmas decorations! If you would like to join us, please contact the <u>church office</u>.



Scout Troop 23 has kicked off its wreath sales! – Sales end October 28 –







Student Ministry

This fall for Student Ministry comes with an incredibly hopeful and aspirational attitude

God has very clearly been working amidst our students and many new friends throughout this summer and that is even flowing into this fall.

Genesis restarted its regular gatherings on Sunday mornings, where we embarked on our first series called Restart. We are using *Grow* curriculum for the second year, and this series tackles some of God's core promises from the Old Testament and the Gospels. We have explored the ideas: when you feel like a failure, god helps you restart. When you feel overwhelmed, God takes care of you. When you feel stuck, God gives you guidance. And when you feel unwanted, God says you belong. The energy has been high, and the discussions have been thorough.









WF began our gatherings in the Attic, featuring a game, a time of worship, a time of teaching, a time to privately reflect on the teaching prompt, and a discussion-based debrief in small groups. The beginning part of this fall, we will be diving into how to practically prioritize our private relationship with God through spiritual disciplines/sacred rhythms. This theme was prompted by a very clear longing and optimism coming off of this summer, with a communal desire to take deeper steps in their faiths. Praise God!

I ask for continued prayers that our students may encounter the Lord in a way that catalyzes them into deeper faith.
