Visual Arts Lenten Displays

According to the Directory for Worship of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter.

This year, you will notice the visual displays in the Sanctuary that are designed to show the spiritual journey of the Lenten season. The liturgical color purple indicates penitence and sacrifice, and will be visible until Easter.

In anticipation of Holy Week, visual elements will represent Christ's final journey to Jerusalem:

- Green palms on Palm Sunday for Jesus' triumphal arrival.
- Bread and cup signifying the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday.
- Nails representing the cross and the color black for mourning his sacrifice on Good Friday.
