Reveal Gratitude

Four weeks ago we were asked to prayerfully make a financial commitment to the **For All Generations** campaign. Thus far, we have received a total of 144 commitments. Even as that number grows, this is evidence that God is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20-21).

With a tremendous amount of gratitude, we have received \$2,317,668.49 in commitments to date. This represents 92% of the campaign's target of 2.5 million dollars.



The 49 cents included are indicative of the church-wide participation in this endeavor thus far. Those cents were part of what our children gathered and contributed. From the youngest to the oldest generation, you have enthusiastically committed to give towards an effort that will further our church's mission of inviting all generations into a growing life with Jesus Christ.
